## A Short Demo of the allrunes Font and Package

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In Björketorp, Blekinge, Sweden, three large stones are erected. On one of them a threatening inscription is made in Primitive Norse:

H\*IMYRN+ & R & + N F\*C\*H\*YH\*IMMR\*X I+\*RN+\*Y\*R\*XMN H\*MR\*M\*C\*N&Y N^1|\*RPMC\*W\*NM &\*YP\*^B\*RN^Y NP\*R\*B\*&B\*

In Torna Hällestad, Skåne, Sweden, three rune stones are set up in the wall of the church, all with normal Scandinavian runes. (But note the special dotted m-rune  $\Psi$  instead of the normal  $\Psi$ .) The longest inscription of the three reads as follows:

In England, now at the British Museum, the stone cross from Lancaster has the following runic inscription:

XIBIMFÞFF RFLM+IBFT ÞLNÞBMRM

In Hög, Härjedalen, Sweden, a stone has an inscription made with staveless runes:
